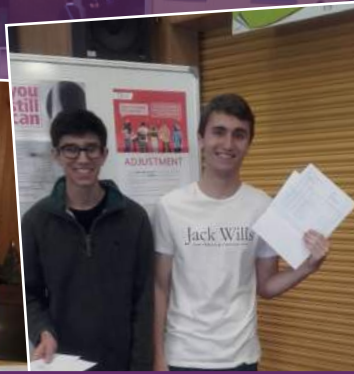
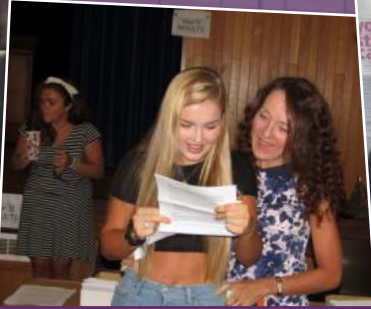

BEST EVER RESULTS

We are absolutely thrilled to have achieved the best results in the history of our school. 100% of our GCSE students gained 5 A* to C passes with 62% of them achieving five or more A* to C passes including English and mathematics. This places the school significantly above the RCT average.

In addition to the headline figures there were some exceptional individual performances which included 10 students with at least 10A* and A grades each. These results maintain the year on year upward trend in our results which is a great credit to our Year 11 students.

A Level results also showed improvement with a further 10% increase in passes at grades A* to C and most

pleasing was that 39% of all grades awarded were at A* and A. By meeting their challenging target grades all students have been able to access university courses of their choice or begin apprenticeships.

These results reflect the commitment and the hard work of staff and students as well as the school's high expectations and standards. Our students have risen to the challenge because the ethos for learning and achievement for all students at Pontypridd High is excellent and they were taught very well. Students were very well motivated, worked very hard and thoroughly deserve what they have achieved.

At School and across the community, many people have contributed to this success - well done to all involved at Pontypridd High.

A LEVEL SUCCESS

I would like to congratulate each of our students who have achieved success with their 'A' level results. I am delighted that we have seen a 7% increase in the number of A* and A grades awarded to 39% and that the number of students achieving passes at A* to C grades has increased by 11%. Our Welsh Bacalaureate results are exceptional with 84% being awarded an A* or A grade, an increase of 10% on the previous year.

Particular mention must be given to Head Girl Lowri Wilkshire who gained A*A*AA and Head Boy Lewis Hooper with ABBC. Great news for Joseph Isingrini who will now take up his place studying Music at Jesus College in Oxford University with 4 A grades. Similarly impressive results were achieved by George Trilloe with A*A*AA and Sophie Jenkins A*A*AB, Tristan Horton AAABC, Zoe Brooks A*ABB and Jack Davidson A*ABBC. Congratulations also to Jonathan Evans A*A*BD, Anne Marie Wattley ABBC, Seren Williams AACC, Georgia Landeg ABBD, Reagan Medcraft A*AB, Amy Davies AAB and Teigan Jones AAC who all performed to an excellent standard. Well done everyone.

In terms of our Sixth Form provision, these results are very encouraging, particularly as students are being challenged and are achieving the highest grades. Most pleasing is that all students who successfully completed courses are now able to access a course and destination of their choice.

As Headteacher I am very much aware that for many of us this success is the result of working in partnership with each family for seven years or more. As always the commitment from all students, staff and the support of each family is greatly appreciated. Mr Bill Davies, Chair of Governors expressed his delight at what has been achieved and congratulates all of the students on their results in addition to thanking staff for their continued hard work and the level of support that ensures Pontypridd High School continues to provide a very successful Sixth Form provision.

We thank those students who are now leaving us for their contribution to our School and wish them well as they move on to new challenges beyond Pontypridd High.

GCSE SUCCESS

At the beginning of Year 10 in 2014 we set our pupils the challenge of achieving the best ever GCSE results and to their credit they have done that and more. I am absolutely delighted for every one of them as are all of the staff.

All pupils have achieved a significant number of qualifications with 100% passing with 5 or more grades at A* to C. Within this, 40% of the pupils in the year group achieved at least 1 grade at A* or A and 10 pupils achieved a minimum of 10 A* and A grades each. It is no surprise that the total % of passes at A* and A grades has increased again from last year. Significantly the number of pupils who have achieved 5 A* to C passes including English and Maths has risen from 53% to 62%. This is the most important indicator when comparing performance in different schools and to see such a big increase in one year is a fantastic reflection on the commitment of pupils and the excellent teaching they are receiving from staff. The support of each family is essential and as always it is very much appreciated.

We have high expectations for our pupils and it is to their credit that they have responded so positively to the challenge we set for them. Our congratulations to everyone, in particular to Atalya Edwards, Zoe Evans, Taylor Ferguson, Logan Hill, Frances Hoey, Jessica Howells Mullen, Bethany Howells, Adam Jones, Elis Pryse and Ciara Richards who all achieved 10 or more A* and A grades each. SCHOOL PERFORMANCE

From the table below it is clear that Pontypridd High is improving in all performance indicators. When compared with similar schools, these results confirm our place amongst the top 25% of in Wales. We are and continue to be very proud of our pupils for maintaining this level of success.

The L2+ indicator includes those pupils who achieve 5 A* to C passes which also includes English and maths. This reflects the quality of our teaching in relation to the core subjects. We are also delighted in our Science results which make our department the most improved in RCT.

This outstanding set of results is well deserved and is closely linked to pupil attendance and their attitudes to learning. We are one of only 3 schools in RCT to have reached their attendance target and in the Summer term our attendance was the highest of any school. This shows the commitment of our pupils to succeed and is testament to the excellent support and working relationships between staff, pupils and their families. ■
