






SCHEMES OF WORK

- The aim is to cover all aspects of the national curriculum, a broad range of skills and prepare students for external exams at KS4.
- Weekly accelerated reader lessons.






ASSESSMENT

- National Reading Test.






NATIONAL READING TEST (ONLINE)




- National Reading Tests (two attempts- first attempt next week)
- •All pupils will be tested for the first time this year via an online testing system.













•An ability to read with understanding is essential to enable effective learning, achievement and success in school and beyond.

Every hour spent reading is an hour spent learning to write.



HOW CAN YOU HELP YOUR CHILD AT HOWE?




- Talk to your child about what they are reading.
 Encourage them to think about and challenge what they have read
- They don't just have to read books…
- Encourage your child to use the local library.
- Keep your child up to date with the news.
- Encourage your child to research various topics using newspaper websites or the BBC website.
- Encourage your child to write book reviews and keep a reading log.
- Be a role model reader.



KS3 READING: WHAT HAPPENS IN SCHOOL?








- Years 7-8 have timetabled weekly Accelerated Reader lessons where pupils are encouraged to read for pleasure while progressing with their reading levels.
- Within these lessons, individual reading, activities and book quizzes take place.
- Schemes of work offer opportunities to read a whole class novel.
- We also encourage pupils to bring in their own reading books.






WRITING








Listening

- Listening is the most important communication skill
- We probably spend more time using our Listening Skills than any other kind of skill
- Like other skills, Listening takes practice
- * Real Listening is an active process
- Listening requires attention





SPEAKING AND LISTENING




Oracy is embedded into every scheme of learning. This is worth 20% of the Language GCSE when they reach Year 10.

Pupils are given specific tasks which include:

- Theatre visits




