

LEARNING & TEACHING

ONLY TOGETHER PROJECT






We have been given the opportunity to take part in a Learning and Teaching project called 'Only Together'. The purpose of the project is to combine creative writing skills with photography to explore what Wales means to us.

This project is being led by Emma Beynon, a writer and creative facilitator, and Richard Greatrex, a photographer. A group of 12 year 9 pupils have taken part in four creative writing workshops with Emma and Richard over the last half term. Each workshop has given the pupils opportunities to write creatively, learn tips and tricks to improve their writing, ask questions and give opinions by exploring a variety of poems and photographs.

The pupils have engaged so well in all sessions and have enjoyed activities such as free writing, creating their own poetry and describing the many different photographs that they have been shown. The pupils have also shared aspects of their own written work in each session; so much of which has been outstanding.

Whilst looking at the different photographs Richard has



led discussions and question based sessions about the way in which photographs are taken and the importance of understanding that many photos, if taken a few seconds later, could be very different. Following this, the pupils have now been tasked with taking a photograph of something that shows what Wales means to them. The pupils will meet again in the Summer term with Emma and Richard to begin the photography aspect of this project.

Here are a few comments from the pupils involved:

Maren: 'I have enjoyed expanding my knowledge on poetry and photography. It has motivated me to do it more often'.

Cole: 'I've enjoyed the fact that we can be very creative and unique and don't have to worry about right or wrong answers'.

Oliver: 'I feel like the workshops have really helped me improve my inference skills'.

Evan: 'I've really enjoyed learning how to use objects as an emotional background'.

GREASE THE MUSICAL


103 pupils from Year 7 – Year 13 have auditioned for our upcoming school show Grease the Musical.
