SHOES

Plain dark, flat shoes, no trainers. Boots may be worn in winter but must be dark and trouser legs must be over boots.

SOCKS

Plain black or white. Black or natural tights may be worn if preferred.

SHIRT / SWEATER

A white, short-sleeved polo shirt with School badge.

Black sweatshirt with School badge or black 'V' necked jumper with School badge or black cardigan with School badge (waist length). A white polo shirt must be worn underneath any of these items.

TROUSERS / SKIRT

Plain black, in a suitably smart style. No jeans or denims.

Skirt must be knee length and acceptable to the School.

SHORTS

In the last half-term of the Summer Term, the Headteacher will decide if black school shorts (not denim, sports shorts or PE shorts) are acceptable instead of trousers. The headteacher will inform parents / carers when the students can wear these shorts through the website or text or letter. The shorts must be SMART BLACK short trousers (above the knee and without combat pockets). The shorts that are acceptable can be purchased from Footrpint (Treforest Industrial Estate).

COAT

Dark, plain. All coats must be removed in classrooms.

'Hoody' tops are not allowed. This includes hooded tops with or without zips.

HATS

Hats must be sensible and are acceptable in colder weather. They are not to be worn inside the school building.

Baseball type caps are not permitted at all.

PE UNIFORM / KIT

Boys and Girls:

- PHS Rugby Shirt, PHS polo shirt, PHS training top, PHS hoody, black or navy shorts, black or navy jogging bottoms, black or navy socks. All tops must have PHS badge. Hoodies must have name on back.
- No grey joggers are permitted. No jewellery to be worn during PE lessons.
- PE kit is to be worn for PE lessons only (please note, hoody not acceptable for some activities).

NB: Pupils will be expected to bring PE kit even if excused and play some role within the lesson. Pupils not bringing the correct kit will follow sanctions as set out in the Positive Relationships policy.

Hairstyle, Jewellery and Make-up

- Pupils are expected to be smart and well-groomed. Excessive make up and jewellery are not acceptable. Make up, if worn, must be discreet. No nail varnish or false nails. Hairstyles must be acceptable and hair colour natural.
- The only permissible items of jewellery are one single fine chain necklace and one ring. Earrings must be stud or small sleeper in style, no more than one per ear.
- No facial piercings are permitted

The School reserves judgement on what is acceptable uniform

- We strongly advise students not to bring valuable items e.g. designer clothing and footwear to school.
- All items worn or brought to School should be marked with the owner's name.
- Serious breaches of the school's uniform requirements will be notified to parents / carers
- Students may be sent home where uniform is unacceptable
- In selected cases the school will assist in the purchase of uniform to maintain our commitment to an 'inclusive' ethos

Trousers, plain black in a suitably smart style. No jeans or denims.

Skirt, plain black in a suitably smart style. Knee length.

Socks - Plain black or white. Black or natural tights may be worn if preferred

UNIFORM
