Our School




Our Lower Block is primarily for Year 7 and 8 pupils and it provides a wonderful base for us to support the transition from primary school to Pontypridd High. It is a 'school within a school', providing facilities that includes a range of classrooms, technology workshops, a performing arts area, science laboratories, IT and different support rooms to support our literacy, numeracy and nurture work. Surrounding the Lower Block is a playing area, half of which is accessed only by Year 7 and the other half by Year 8 pupils.

Looking after Wellbeing and Learning



Our school is organised around staff teams, each with different responsibilities. Mr Rhys Ivins has overall responsibility for Years 7 and 8 and Mrs Kerry Stockman leads on academic progress and standards. Mrs Katie Rees has responsibility for all the wellbeing and safeguarding support in Years 7 and 8.

Learning the skills to be successful



The world is changing rapidly, with huge advances in technology, lifestyles and the world of work. These changes have real implications for what, and how our children need to learn.

Our curriculum in year 7 has improve specific themes that knowledge and understanding importantly but most students excellent learning opportunities that focus skills in improving literacy, digital numeracy and competency.

Each term we deliver learning experiences that are based around a central theme. For the Autumn Term, 2021 this theme is about the inspirational work of Greta Thunberg and her message that 'No one is to small to make a difference'.

In the new year we will be looking at J.K. Rowling's belief that 'if you don't like reading, you haven't found the right book'.





The themes allow all of the learning to be joined up and for every child to recognise the links between all of their work.

Expectations for Uniform



We expect our students to be smartly dressed at all times and our school uniform is a good way to show that you belong to our community.

It is also a way of displaying a positive attitude and shows you are proud to be part of our school.

Shoes - Plain black, flat shoes.

Socks - Plain black or white. Black or natural tights may be worn if preferred.

Trousers/Skirt - Plain black in a suitably smart style. No jeans or types of denim. The skirt MUST be knee-length and acceptable to the school.

Shirt/Sweater - A white, short-sleeved polo shirt with a school badge. A black sweatshirt with a school badge, a black v-knecked jumper with a school badge or a black waist-length cardigan with a school badge.

Coat – Dark plain, black fleeces, fleece-lined and waterproof jackets with the school badge are available. All coats must be removed in classrooms.

Hooded jumpers are not allowed.
