
Year 9 Welsh Department Sports Week


Mathematics Department: Design a Paper Aeroplane Competition.





Year 6 pupils from our cluster Primary Schools have spent the last weeks of the summer term competing in the PHS Design a Paper Aeroplane Competition. In order to enter pupils had to work together as a team to design the paper aeroplane that would travel the furthest and the fastest. The competition presented pupils with an ideal opportunity to consolidate their literacy and numeracy skills in preparation for the start of year 7 in September.

The teams set to work researching the benefits of different materials and designs and testing their prototype models in school. They collected data that they analysed using their knowledge of averages and displayed their results using a range of different charts.
