


Our current Year 11 pupils have recently sat one of their GCSE Maths exams. We are delighted that at this stage of the year, the results are the highest we have recorded. This means we are well on our way to achieving a set of final results which will keep us in the top 25% of schools in Wales.

Impressively 31 pupils achieved an A* or A grade. Particular mention to Elis Pryce who had the highest score in the year.

Walking The Beacons

As part of the wellbeing agenda, all pupils from year 7 are given the opportunity to attend at least one walk throughout the academic year. These include Pen Y Fan, Fan Frynach or Sgwd Yr Elra. The walks are led by a qualified mountain leader, Steve Axe. Pupils learn about the natural history and have the opportunity to explore the beautiful Brecon Beacons.
